


## How Do They Do That?!

This new landscape of Mount Monadnock was first painted by local artist Deb Pero on 288 canvas panels tied together inside a wooden frame. When dry, each panel was selected by artists to use as miniature canvases for another picture. The technique is known as a mural-mosaic. The challenge to the artists was that they had to follow the colors, lines and hues of the panel they selected - a true partnership of talents.


### The panel selected by the artist:

## The Park Theatre's Mural Project: A Legacy for our Communities

*Mounted on the walls of the original Theatre were four 9-by-17 foot murals depicting Mount Monadnock when seen from the towns around the mountain during the four seasons. These murals were painted by New Hampshire muralist Carl Eric Nelson in 1941 and will be installed in the rebuilt Theatre.*

*As a part of the rebuilding and reopening of The Park Theatre, Trustees created a fifth mural to celebrate the future of the Theatre and to honor the four historic murals. This new mural, on the same grand scale as the original murals, is made of 288 individual panels—each one a work of art itself and depicting life in the Monadnock Region. The "Fifth Mountain Mural" will be displayed in the new Theatre lobby as a part of its permanent collection.*
